

Course Introduction

There is a lot of information and ideas out there about Jesus. Type in "Jesus" into any search engine and you will get not only a large *quantity* of hits, but you will get a large *variety* as well. Sorting through all of that to decipher who Jesus really was and what he stood for, believed in, and did can be daunting. More personally, answering the question: "What do I believe about Jesus?" can be even more complex and overwhelming.

In the Bible, that complexity is revealed in 4 different accounts from 4 different people in 4 different socio-cultural situations. These gospels offer us a kind of map to guide our thinking about Jesus. They are the way to wrap our minds around this interesting person who claimed to be the way to God.

Reading these gospels will help us enjoy and appreciate the wonderful personality, mission, identity, and heart of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

Course Description

This course includes 5 modules; each designed to move you closer to a deeper understanding of Jesus as revealed in the Gospels. The first two will provide a background for understanding Jesus. They will consider the Gospels themselves (what kind of books are these?) and the Incarnation (what does it mean that God came to us in Jesus?). Then in the next three units will we look at what Jesus and Kingdom of God, the significance of Jesus' death and resurrection, and what discipleship means and how it works in the gospels. Through all of this, you will also be provided with a space to consider your own beliefs about Jesus.

This is a 1 semester course consisting of 5 units. Upon successful completion students will receive 0.5 credit towards high school graduation.

Course Outcomes

As a result of this course, the student should:

- 1. Know what the majority of what the Gospels say
- Identify key people, themes, and happenings in the Gospels, especially the Kingdom of God
- 3. Understand what the Gospels reveal about Jesus' character and purpose
- 4. Become a more critical thinker as you engage with the Gospels
- 5. See the relevance of the Jesus in contemporary thought
- 6. Meaningfully converse with others about Jesus and the Gospels
- 7. See Jesus' salvation as part of God's full salvation story in the Bible
- 8. Begin to develop an idea of what it means to be a follower of Jesus then and today
